Exhibition by female artists with disability expresses their individuality

Ahead of International Women's Day tomorrow, Tutti Arts is preparing for an exhibition that will celebrate the talents and perspectives of its female artists with disability. Nine Tutti visual artists have created large scale works that range from vibrant and bold to soft and pastel for the exhibition which is entitled *Fierce*. Each work reflects the personal interests and artistic style of the artist without the limitations of an exhibition theme.

Tutti Arts CEO Pat Rix says, "This body of work will challenge stereotypes that female disabled artists are heroes, or victims, or martyrs. In fact, they are fiercely connecting with the world as passionate artists without pressure to conform to hierarchical divisions based on gender or disability."

The *Fierce* exhibition will be held at Fisher Jeffries, 19 Gouger Street, Adelaide during April 2018.
