***Say No More* to make its highly anticipated Australian premiere**

Following a world premiere which had audiences in Malaysia buzzing, Tutti Arts' contemporary multi arts work *Say No More* will have its Australian premiere at the OzAsia Festival this November.

Say No More is a rich collage of women's stories, told via song, film, spoken word, sign language and visual art. 26 women artists from Australia, Indonesia and Malaysia draw on deeply personal experiences to create a wedding reception like no other. Woven throughout, the myth and romance of the perfect wedding is both indulged and exposed through stories of longing, disempowerment, and ultimately survival.

The Penang Monthly described *Say No More* as "raw, intense and probing". The Edge Malaysia included *Say No More* in its top ten shows of the 2018 George Town Festival.

Say No More was created by artists with and without disability based at Tutti Arts (Adelaide), Perspektif (Indonesia) and Stepping Stone (Malaysia).

Tutti Arts Artistic Director and CEO, Pat Rix, says, "*Say No More* is truly ground-breaking in the way that it gives visibility to the voice of young women artists with disability in Asia and Australia.

"This work goes beyond hierarchical divisions based on disability, gender, race, sexuality and religion to examine the truths and the lies that women encounter at key milestones in their lives."
