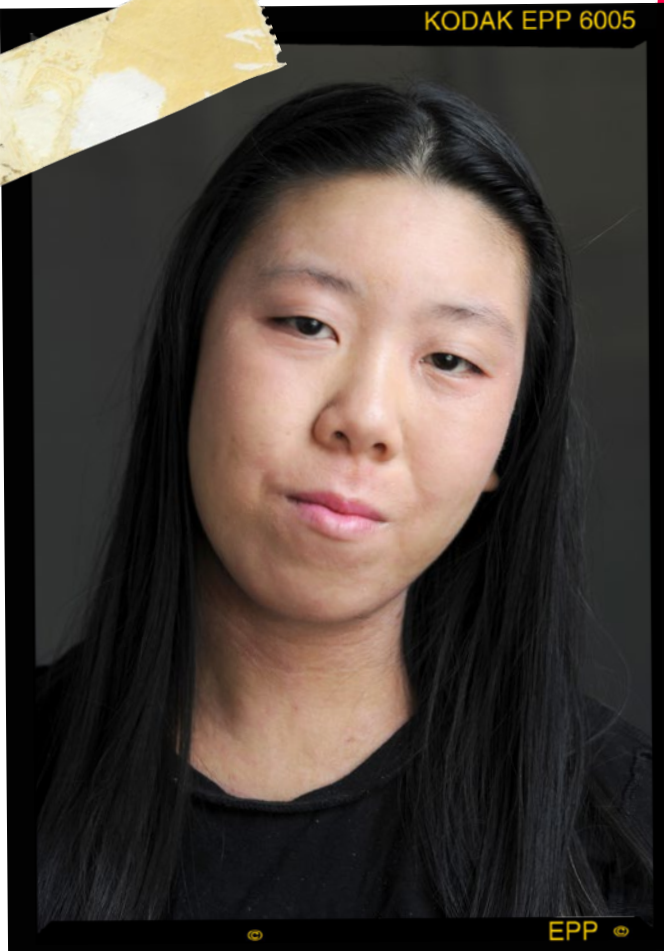

Caroline Hardy

Caroline is a singer and member of *The Sisters of Invention*, *Thank God It's Friday* and *Tutti Choir* based at Tutti Brighton. Her highlights in 2024 included performing at Perth International Cabaret Festival at His Majesty's Theatre.

Caroline is a music industry award winner, with *The Sisters of Invention* winning the Community Achievement Award at the 2024 SA Music Awards.



James Kurtze

James is a film maker, radio presenter, hacker, maker and performer based at Tutti Brighton. 2024 was a busy year for him. He started the year performing in *Floods of Fire* for the Adelaide Festival, then completed and launched his digital Pinball Machine.

'The launch of my Pinball machine was a good time, showing everybody how I built it, some parts recycled, some parts new. People played the game at the launch.'

As a member of Radio Tutti, James won Best Radio Program for his Three D Radio show *'The RaT'* at the SACBA Bilby Awards.

'It felt great to win the award, to win with the group, not just myself. I now want to set up Tutti TV!'

James was also a founding committee member helping to launch the 2024 *Sit Down Shutup and Watch* film festival. James loves designing, making and using technology. He has a passion for turning old things into new things.

Rebecca Eglinton

Rebecca is a visual artist based at Tutti Barossa. In 2024, Rebecca together with fellow artist, Johanna Roberts, led on the transformational placemaking projects *Inside Out* and *Meeting Place*. The first sculpture created for *Meeting Place* was awarded a Commendation in the highly competitive Barossa Arts Festival Sculpture Competition.

'Working on [*Inside Out* and *Meeting Place*] was quite massive for me, working between nature and created objects. I definitely learned a lot from it; it was outside of what I was used to. I would love to do it again.'

A prolific artist, in 2024 Rebecca's work was exhibited in several exhibitions both solo and group. Significantly she was part of *Flourish* at the Barossa Regional Arts Gallery (Tutti Arts and Gilbert Dashorst), and the Tutti Barossa Open Studio for Barossa Arts Festival. Rebecca currently volunteers at the Barossa Regional Arts Gallery, The Angaston Gallery & Gift Shop and Tutti Arts, supporting young aspiring artists at Tutti Kids & Youth.

Michael Tye

Michael is a musician and visual artist based at Tutti Brighton. In 2024 Michael performed in *Floods of Fire* for the Adelaide Festival, performed at the album launch 'Outta This Quirky World' for Tutti's 13-piece, experimental rock band *Quirkestra* and was a musician for Tutti's new major collaborative performance *Final Frontier* during the creative development phase.

Jackie is a Ngarrindjeri and Wirangu contemporary visual artist based at Tutti Brighton. In 2024, Jackie's painting, *Desert Sundown* (Alice Springs), was acquired by the Art Gallery of South Australia.

Jackie also took part in a visual arts residency and exhibition at Sauerbier House in Port Noarlunga with collaborator Laura Wills as part of the City of Onkaparinga arts program.

'My highlights from the residency were sand drawings, jumping in the ocean and using my designs for t-shirts.'

Floods of Fire: Our Voices, Our Dreams

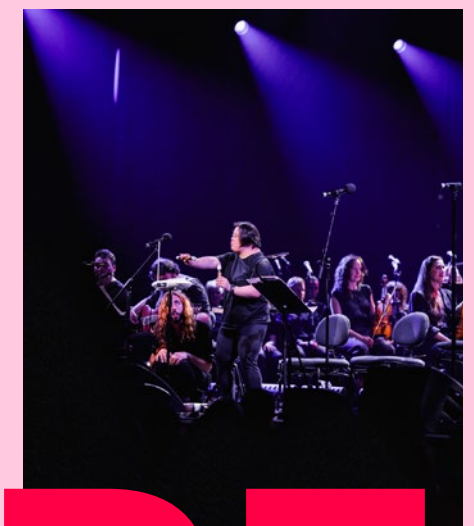
Company AT, Screen, Acting, Dance and Visual Arts presented thought-provoking artistic interventions. This event took place around the grounds of the University of Adelaide.

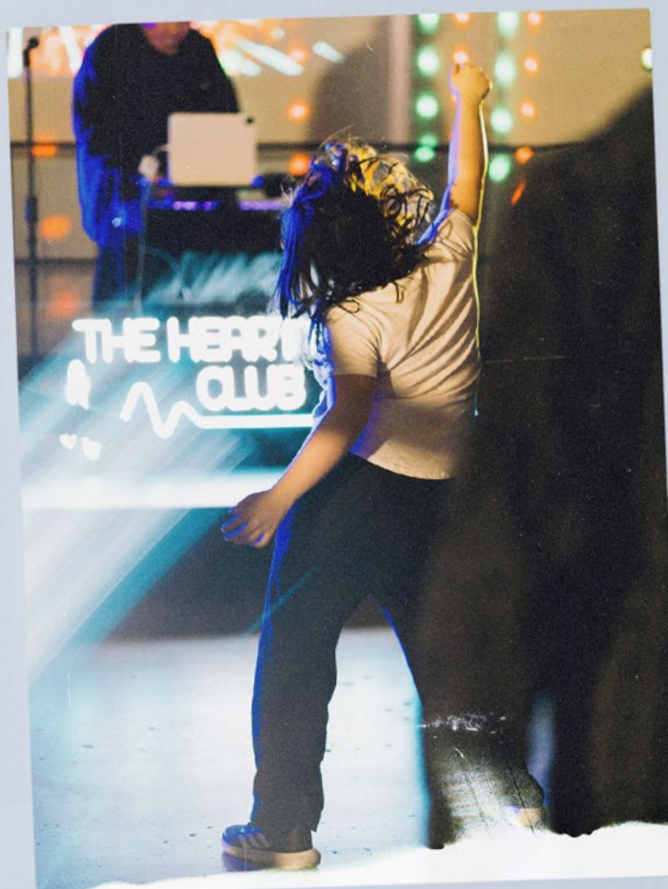

A club night run by and for learning disabled people, their friends and allies. *The Heart Beat Club* is a place to party! Connect! Dance to DJs! Hang out with friends and celebrate music in a welcoming and accessible environment.

This year there were four vibing club nights held in and around Adelaide to sell-out crowds, at Nexus Arts, Jackson Square, and M.O.D. All the DJs ate their performances!

(Ate: To do something exceptionally well)

Each club night was packed with fun. There were live sets by *The Sisters of Invention* and a high-energy dance performance by Tutti dancers. You could chill in lounge areas, grab a bite from food trucks, hit the bar, play arcade games, and more.

'I like going to *The Heart Beat Club* – it's fun and I've been lots of times, I've lost count how many. It's a great place to hang out.'

The Heart Beat Club is run by the *Beats Crew*, a group of learning-disabled people. The 2024 club nights were supported by City of Adelaide Cultural Strategic Partnerships Initiative, Arts SA and Access2Arts.

Sit Down Shutup and Watch (SDSW) had a huge year of creativity, community, and growth.

Run by learning disabled and neurodivergent film lovers. The committee focused on:

1. making bold work
2. building partnerships
3. reaching new audiences across S.A.
4. promoting disabled voices in screen

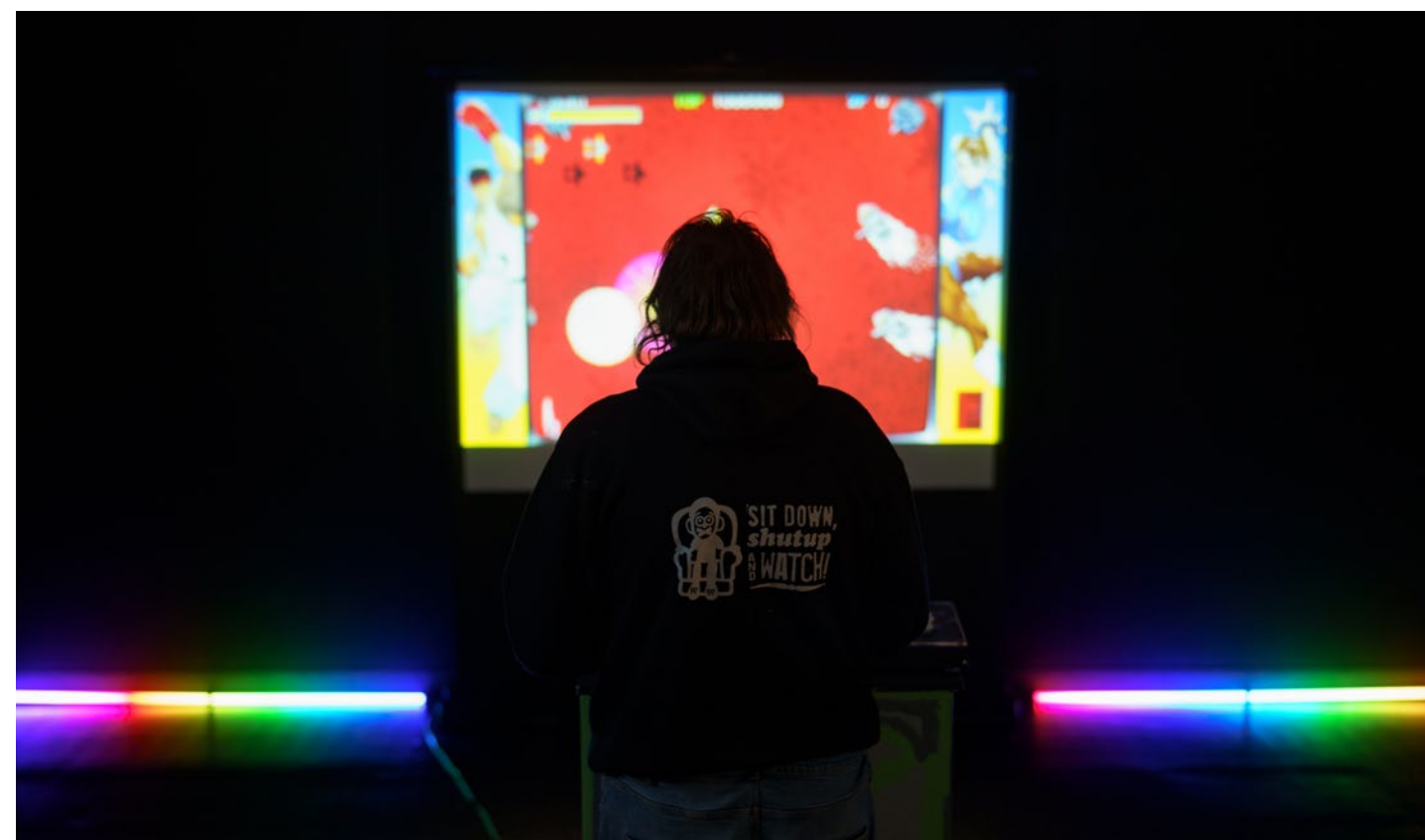

& COMFORT ZONE

A highlight of the year was the return of *The Comfort Zone*. Supported by Arts SA, *Comfort Zone* is a fun, mobile tech space for creatives to explore film, 3D design, and avatars. The first stop in Whyalla was a big hit with two days of workshops in partnership with Why Day and D'Faces of Youth. Later in the year *Comfort Zones* were run in Brighton and Barossa.

SDSW worked with Tutti actors and editors along with SAHMRI and Flinders University. They made seven short films. The films were designed to support mental health and will be used in workshops and at events.

The 2024 SDSW Screen Festival, was nicknamed "The Feel Festival." The festival featured 20 short films from disabled filmmakers around the world. It included 10 days of online screenings and two live events with games, films, and hands-on tech fun.

After many years of valued service, Lee Witczak resigned as Chairperson and from the Committee of SDSW. Sara Egarr stepped into the role of Chairperson and was invited to join the programming panel of the Adelaide Film Festival.

SDSW continues to lead the way in inclusive, creative storytelling.

They both accepted the award and Aimee gave an awesome speech. There were tears, cheers and deep pride!

Making Space Exhibition

Making Space was a colourful and bold collaboration between Tutti Artists and established South Australian Artist, Arlon Hall.

The artists explored how people, light, and objects move through space. This resulted in a playful exhibition full of abstract paintings, sculptures, and installations.

'This gave me great insights into the resilience and perseverance required to be a Tutti artist. The Tutti artists demonstrated great care for one another and proved to be a tight community of professionals.'

They worked with recycled materials from the Adelaide Festival Centre archives and storerooms. They used vinyl banners, theatre posters, house paint and more!

Each artist bought their own unique perspective and artistic style to the exhibition. Jasmine Jone's work considered colour and space. Scott Pyle created monsters inspired by the Power Rangers and surf culture. Charlie Taplin brought repetitive shapes and patterns. Megan Long had distinct and colourful natural motifs.

AGSA Acquisition

In a first for both the artist and Tutti Arts as an organisation, talented disabled artist and proud Wirangu and Ngarrindjeri woman Jackie Saunders' work *Desert Sundown (Alice Springs)* was acquired by the Art Gallery of South Australia (AGSA).

Desert Sundown (Alice Springs) featured in *Land, Light and Water*, Jackie's solo exhibition presented in partnership with The Hospital Research Foundation Group – Creative Health at the Royal Adelaide Hospital for Tarnanthi Festival 2023.

Tarnanthi is AGSA's festival of contemporary Aboriginal and Torres

Strait Islander art and is acclaimed as Australia's leading First Nations art festival.

'AGSA is thrilled to have acquired Jackie's work for the collection, a milestone moment in her career. Her visual arts practice is the culmination of her relentless pursuit of both catharsis and mindfulness, and her reconnection with family and culture. The work is bold, vibrant and dynamic much like Jackie herself.'

Lewis Constantine took part in a groundbreaking arts residency in South Korea.

The residency was a partnership with Tutti Arts, Co-art Studio and IZZA IZZA Korea, and was held at Artspace Seochon in Seoul.

The residency was a moment of real cultural connection. Lewis worked alongside South Korean disabled artist Euihyun Shin. He also undertook cultural experiences in Seoul.

Lewis and Patricia Wozniak from Tutti gave a presentation at Sungkyunkwan University. They engaged students in discussions about disability-led art practice and international exchange.

Lewis described the experience as "incredible," and one that he hopes to repeat.

SCREEN ACTORS

Casting directors were reaching out in 2024 via Showcast requesting self-tapes from a number of Tutti actors for commercials and television work.



In mid-2024, Producer Jasmin Leech and Writer and Director David Darebin, of short film *Liability*, joined Tutti's Acting studio program for four workshops.

Tutti artist Josh Campton was cast in the lead role of Kyle in the film and was a key creative on the project. Michael Murphy and Jenna May were employed as film extras. Our acting coordinator, creative enabler and cast advocate Catherine Fitzgerald also got a role!

Liability follows Louis, a socially awkward support worker, who discovers a few things were left out of his job description when he's paired with Kyle, a young rapper with Down Syndrome and a dangerous side hustle. With Official Partners Tutti & Mercury, *Liability* will premiere in 2025!



Creative Partnership Plus 1

Thank you to everyone that helped Tutti raise \$50,000.

This was matched dollar for dollar by Creative Australia through Plus 1. This money has helped Tutti artists grow and take their careers to the next level. The funding helped pay for important things like professional headshots and artist biographies.

Artists were supported to enter art competitions, apply for residencies, audition and perform. An Artist Development Coordinator is now on staff to support artists to build their career paths.

Tutti Arts Barossa turned their studio into a lively outdoor art space with two projects, *Inside Out* and *Meeting Place*.

Inside Out is a visual story. Tutti artists created a 37 metre mural, inspired by nature and movement.

Meeting Place is an impressive native garden where artists created three large sculptures. One sculpture included audio visual features. There is a central meeting circle and a native garden with over 200 plants! One sculpture won an award at The Barossa Bushgardens Sculpture Walk.

Tutti artists Johanna Roberts and Rebecca Eglinton led these projects. They were supported by artist Nina Rupena.

Both projects launched in August. The launch brought the community together for a huge celebration!

These projects have transformed the studio's exterior into a bright, creative gathering place.

The projects were made possible thanks to generous support from Foundation Barossa, the Peter Lehmann Arts & Education Trust, The Barossa Council, Natural Style Building Company, Barossa Bushgardens, Kuchel Landscape Supplies, and Barossa Mitre 10.

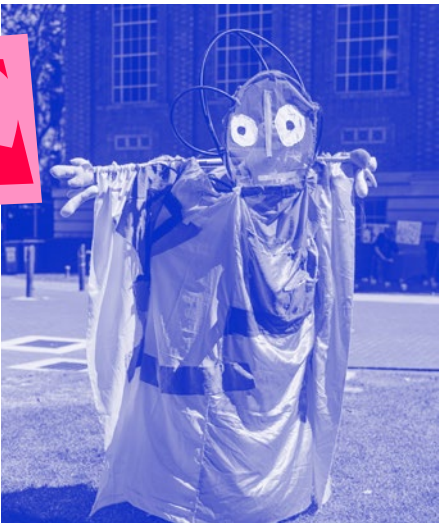



