Role Purpose

The Choir Accompanist / Deputy Lead supports two inclusive choirs - Tutti Choir and Poco Tutti - by providing piano accompaniment and musical leadership. These choirs welcome disabled and non-disabled singers and perform regularly across South Australia.

This role combines strong piano accompaniment skills with a working knowledge of vocal technique to support singers in learning melodies and harmonies. The Deputy Lead collaborates closely with the Coordinator and will have the skills to step into lead the choir from time to time when required.

Key Responsibilities

Musical Accompaniment

Provide piano accompaniment for rehearsals and performances

- Assist with teaching vocal lines and harmonies
- Support individual singers with vocal coaching
- Prepare rehearsal materials as needed

Leadership & Collaboration

- Foster a welcoming, barrier-free, and empowering rehearsal environment where everyone can participate fully.
- Build respectful, professional relationships with participants
- Support the musical and personal development of choir members
- Lead the choir when required
- Work collaboratively with diverse groups and guest artists
- Embrace feedback and innovation to improve choir experiences

Organisational Contribution

- Attend out-of-hours rehearsals or performances as required
- Fulfill additional duties aligned with the role and classification
- Adapt to evolving responsibilities as directed by leadership
