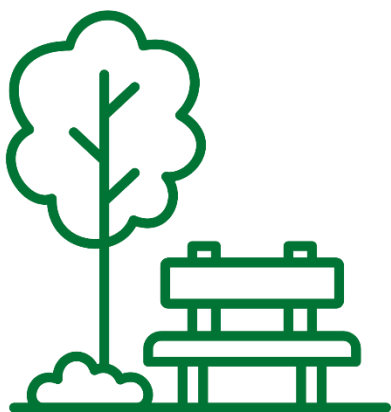

Gluttony is in Murlawirrapurka, Rymill Park in the city's parklands.



Because Gluttony is in a park some of the ground can be uneven.



There are lots of venues at Gluttony for Adelaide Fringe shows. It looks like a big carnival in the park.

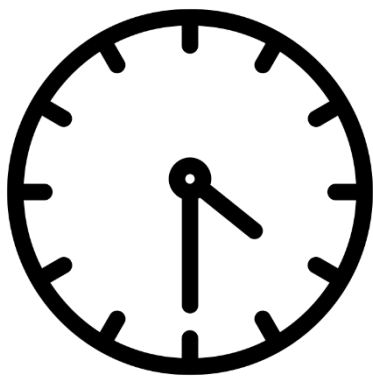

Loud and Proud is a **choir** performance

Choir means a group of people who sing together.

4:30pm

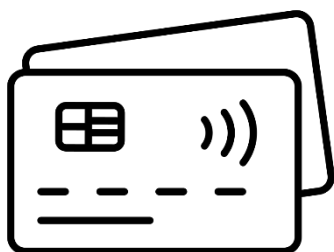
The show goes for 1 hour.

When we get there, if I need to get tickets. I might have to wait in a queue, but it won't take long.



There are lots of box offices at Gluttony. They look like this.

If I want to, I can get something to eat and drink. I will need to travel 120 meters from the Fantail to the closest food trucks.



I will need to pay with a card.

Before we take our seats in the **auditorium**, I can use the toilet.

Auditorium means a large space for an audience to sit, watch, and hear performances.

If I need to use the toilet, I can ask the person I am with. I will need to travel 42m from the Fantail to the nearest toilets.



I can fill my water bottle up near the toilets.



This is the entrance to the Fantail.

I may need to line up outside the Fantail before the show starts.

I will show my tickets to a Gluttony staff member wearing a green, Gluttony lanyard.

Lanyard is like a necklace that holds a staff card.

Next, I go into the Fantail venue to watch the show. The venue is very big and there are lots of seats! I need to find a seat and sit down.

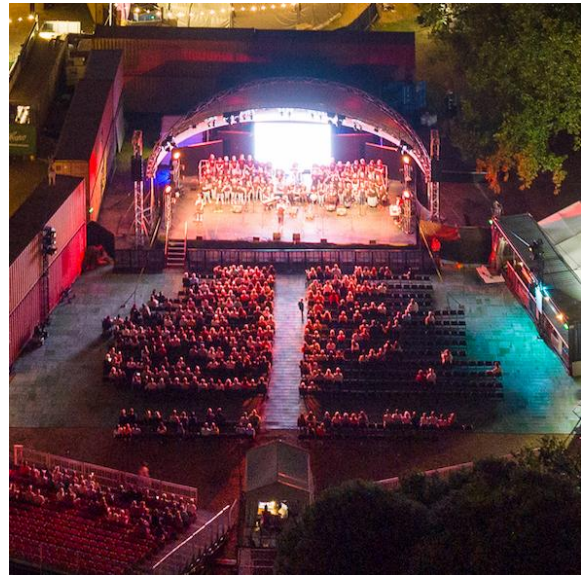
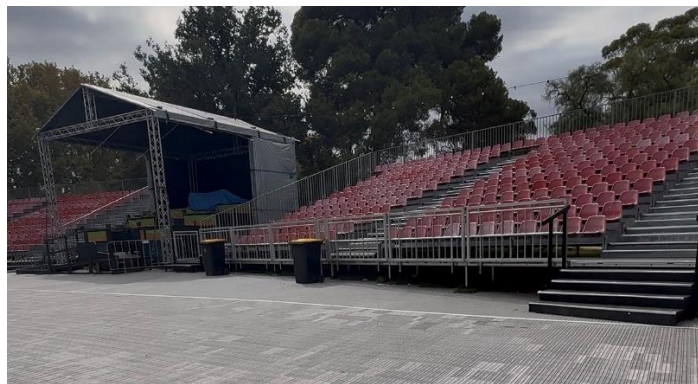

The Fantail is an open-air venue within Gluttony. I will be able to look up and see the sky.





I should use my sunscreen



If I use Auslan I can sit in the reserved area near the interpreter.



Before the show starts, I must turn off my mobile phone if I have one.



I am not allowed to take photographs inside the auditorium.

The show will start with a Welcome to Country. This is to welcome visitors onto Aboriginal land.

When the show starts people will be quieter so they can hear the choir.

There are lots of choir performers. Around 60 people!

Everyone in the choir will sing together.

Sometimes there will only be one person singing. This is called a solo.

Members of the choir will be wearing t-shirts that say LOUD PROUD in big letters.



All the colours on their T-shirts are from the Disability Pride flag.



These T-shirts will be on sale outside the venue for \$45 after the show.

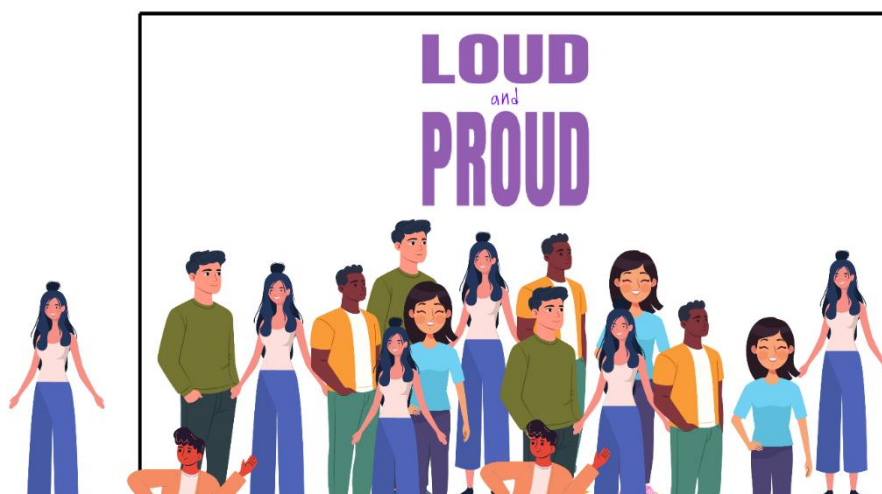
The T-shirts can also be bought from [Tutti's online shop](#).

The choir will be singing songs by disabled singers and songwriters.

Nat Luna is a disabled singer from Adelaide. She is a guest star. Nat will perform two of her songs during the show.



There is a big screen behind the performers. The screen will show images and words during the performance.



Some people in the audience might react to the performance by clapping, cheering or laughing.

Sometimes different parts of the show can be loud. If the sound bothers me, I can put my hands over my ears or wear my ear defenders

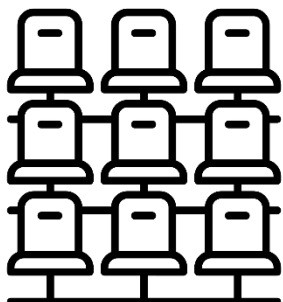


Sometimes being around people singing can make me feel strong emotions. [Download the song list with key emotions.](#)

Loud and Proud is a Relaxed Performance. This means I can:



Move around or dance if I want to



Change seats if I want to



Sing along if I want to

Bring my fidgets, or weighted blanket or ear defenders if I want to use them.



I can go outside the Fantail and come back inside during the performance.



When the show has finished, the audience will clap to tell the choir they enjoyed the performance.

I will leave the Fantail and Gluttony.

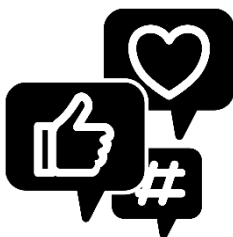
