There is one marked accessible park and five unmarked accessible car parks behind the Tutti building.

The surface of the car park is concrete and the outer spaces are gravel.



Main entrance

The front entrance to the building has two ramps with small inclines.



Rear entrance

There is an entrance at the back of the building from the rear car park.



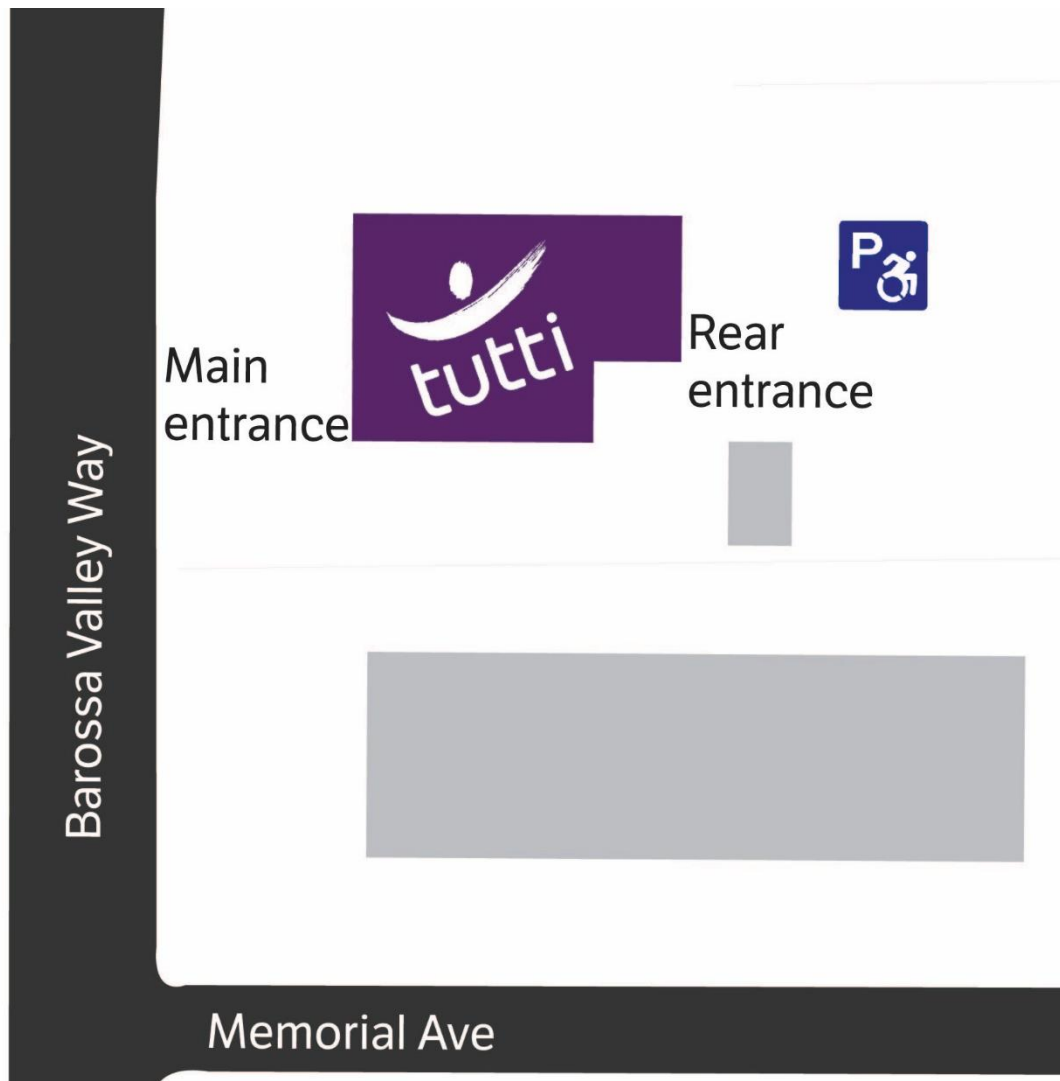
Accessible toilet

Good vibes only

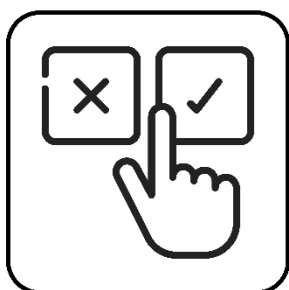
We ask all our staff, artists and visitors to be kind, friendly, respectful of differences. We have a zero tolerance policy towards violence and abuse.

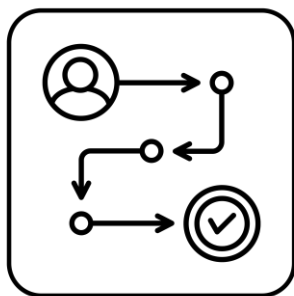
